
COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT SERVICES



"I was feeling stagnant on my goals, and now I'm making progress on them."

Sam began working with a Foundational Community Support program in 2021 after she was discharged from inpatient treatment for substance use disorder. Sam was able to find a job on her own working as a maintenance technician at Olalla Recovery Center.

However, Sam had long-term aspirations of using her lived experiences to benefit local communities by becoming a licensed clinical social worker, she was nervous about navigating being an adult college student while managing a full-time job so she reached out to Skookum and reenrolled in services.

That's when Sam began meeting weekly with her employment specialist and was able to enroll in winter quarter classes at Tacoma community college (TCC) to begin working on her associate degree in human services. during this time, Sam also took a new position with Amazon as a delivery partner, which would give her increased flexibility in her work schedule and allow her to attend classes easily. She's been able to develop a support system of fellow peers at TCC and was able to advocate for herself to get the disability accommodations she needed.

There are a lot of jobs available in Sequim, however many of those jobs required more education than what Shawnie had.

Despite her barriers, Shawnie found the perfect job, she is now working at Mervin Manufacturing as an Edger who assists with the manufacturing of snowboards. Shawnie was also extremely excited to share how supportive she felt by her employer when she self-advocated for her disability accommodations in the workplace. She has aspirations to enroll in community college this upcoming fall to major in an environmental science focus.

- How to use a tablet or smart phone



Plan to Work is a free and voluntary service available to individuals in the state of Washington (except southern counties Pacific, Lewis, Wahkiakum, Cowlitz, Clark, Skamania, Klickitat, Benton, Franklin, and Walla Walla) who

are currently receiving disability benefits from the Social Security Administration and want to work. We answer questions about how work affects benefits, and identify work incentives to support career goals.
